



14 PREPARE AREA FOR RENOVATION


The day is finally here! Make sure you clear out your area being renovated, have a clear path from the door, and maybe even get some coverings for nearby furniture, it's about to get dirty!


WORKING ON TOO MANY ROOMS AT ONCE
